

## **Glendale Bicyclist and Pedestrian Survey 2010**

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### Introduction

As part of the PLACE Grant - Safe & Healthy Streets initiative to make Glendale better and safer for pedestrians and bicyclists, the Los Angeles County Bicycle Coalition (LACBC) and the City of Glendale asked for responses to an online survey regarding walking and biking. Responses from people who live, work, or go to school in Glendale were strongly encouraged, but these were not requirements for completing the survey. The goal was to collect more detailed information about walking and biking in Glendale, to supplement information collected during a series of community meetings that were held in the fall of 2009. The information gathered was intended to help the LACBC and the City draft the Safe & Healthy Streets Plan. The results of this survey are also being incorporated into the 2011 update of the Glendale Bikeway Master Plan and can be used by the City for other pedestrian and bicycle related projects, programs, or planning documents. The survey was posted online from February to August of 2010. This survey was conducted online only. It was promoted via the Safe & Healthy Streets website, e-mail notifications, requests to existing community groups, the City of Glendale website, and through announcements at City Council meetings. During the survey period, 294 people responded. The gender split between male and female was nearly equal; 50.4% were female and 49.6% were male (42 respondents declined to answer). Roughly 60% of the respondents indicated that they live in Glendale and 56% indicated that they work in Glendale. The respondents were all age 18 or older and the age group 51-62 was the largest to respond, followed by the group 41-50. More detailed demographic data can be found in the results to questions 28-32.


This report is divided into two sections. Section 1 presents the results of the survey in chart form. Section 2 presents the responses in greater detail, organized into tables. The answers to questions 1, 2, and 33 could not be presented in charts, so they are not included in Section 1. Thus, Section 1 begins with question number 3. The answers to questions 1, 2 and 33 are included in Section 2. The results of question 34 contain personal information, so the results of this question are not included in this report.

It should be noted that not every question in the survey was required. Questions 1, 2, 8, 9, 11, 12, 20, 21, 33, and 34 were optional. The rest of the survey consisted of required questions. The responses to some questions triggered the survey to automatically skip questions that did not apply, based on the response selected. For example, Question 5 asked the respondent about the frequency of walking in the previous 6 months. If the respondent answered that they hadn't walked during this time period, the survey skipped ahead to Question 10, omitting questions that asked for more detail related to walking. The questions with automatic triggers are identified in this report in both sections 1 & 2 with notes indicating how many respondents triggered the survey to skip forward.



### 3. What modes of transportation do you typically use for your work or school commute?




### How often do you use each mode of transportation for your commute?







### 5. How often did you walk in the last 6 months (for commuting, recreation, errands, etc)?




### 6. Depending on the purpose of your trip, approximately how long is your average walk?

### 7. Why Do You Walk?




### 8. What are the areas in Glendale where you enjoy walking?



#### 10. Why do you ride a bike?






### 11. What are you favorite places to ride in Glendale?

### 12. Areas of Glendale where bicycling conditions should be improved.








### 14. How often did you bike in the last 6 months?



### 16. What prevents you from biking more often?





### 17. Do you ever use your bicycle with transit (train/light rail/subway/bus)?




### 18. If you do use your bicycle with transit, how frequently?

### 19. What transit operator(s) do you use with your bicycle?



### 20. If you do not use your bicycle with transit, what, if any, are the barriers preventing you?





### 21. Please indicate areas in Glendale where you would like to see more or improved bicycle parking.




### 22. What type of bicycling support facility do you prefer?

#### 23. Do you mountain bike in the Verdugo Hills, the San Gabriel Mountains, or other areas above Glendale?



### 24. If you do mountain bike above Glendale, from which trailhead?



#### 25. Do you ride to the trailhead?




## 26. Would the following improvements influence you to bike more often? (Please rate each improvement by likelihood of influencing you to bike more often)


## 27. Please Prioritize the following encouragement programs (1 being Most Preferred and 5 Least Preferred) for implementation in Glendale.

38	As a longtime resident of Glendale and an occasional cyclist, I appreciate the efforts the city is making to make Glendale streets more bicycle friendly.  One area that deserves attention as planners consider what streets should be modified to be more bicycle friendly is Verdugo Road between Glendale City College up to where Verdugo again meets with Canada in the Sparr Heights area. This is a heavily traveled area for many cyclists and a busy street for cars as well. Some modification on this section of road would help both automobiles and bicycles be able to share the road more safely.  For a model of how this road could look, I would ask you to consider Verdugo Ave. in Burbank. For as long as I can remember, Verdugo Ave. in Burbank (between Hollywood Way and Buena Vista and beyond) was configured much the same as Verdugo Road in Glendale: two lanes either way, parking on both sides, no bike lanes, and no left-turn turnouts. Now this stretch of Verdugo in Burbank has been reconfigured to include a left-turn turnout for all intersections, bike lanes on both sides and only one lane for cars in either direction. Now cars and bicycles share this road with a much greater degree of safety and traffic is not slowed because of the loss of the extra lane (due in part to the exclusive left-turn lane
	that was created during the modification).  This same kind of configuration would work very well along Verdugo Road. Having ridden my bicycle to work on a few occasions (up to La Crescenta), I know how treacherous this street can be. I hope that as the city considers creating bike lanes that this stretch of Verdugo Road will be one of the areas considered.
39	Please, I can't emphasize this enough: Glendale needs much more frequent traffic, read speed limit, enforcement. Cars routinely speed through my neighborhood, neglect stop signs, at all hours of the day.
