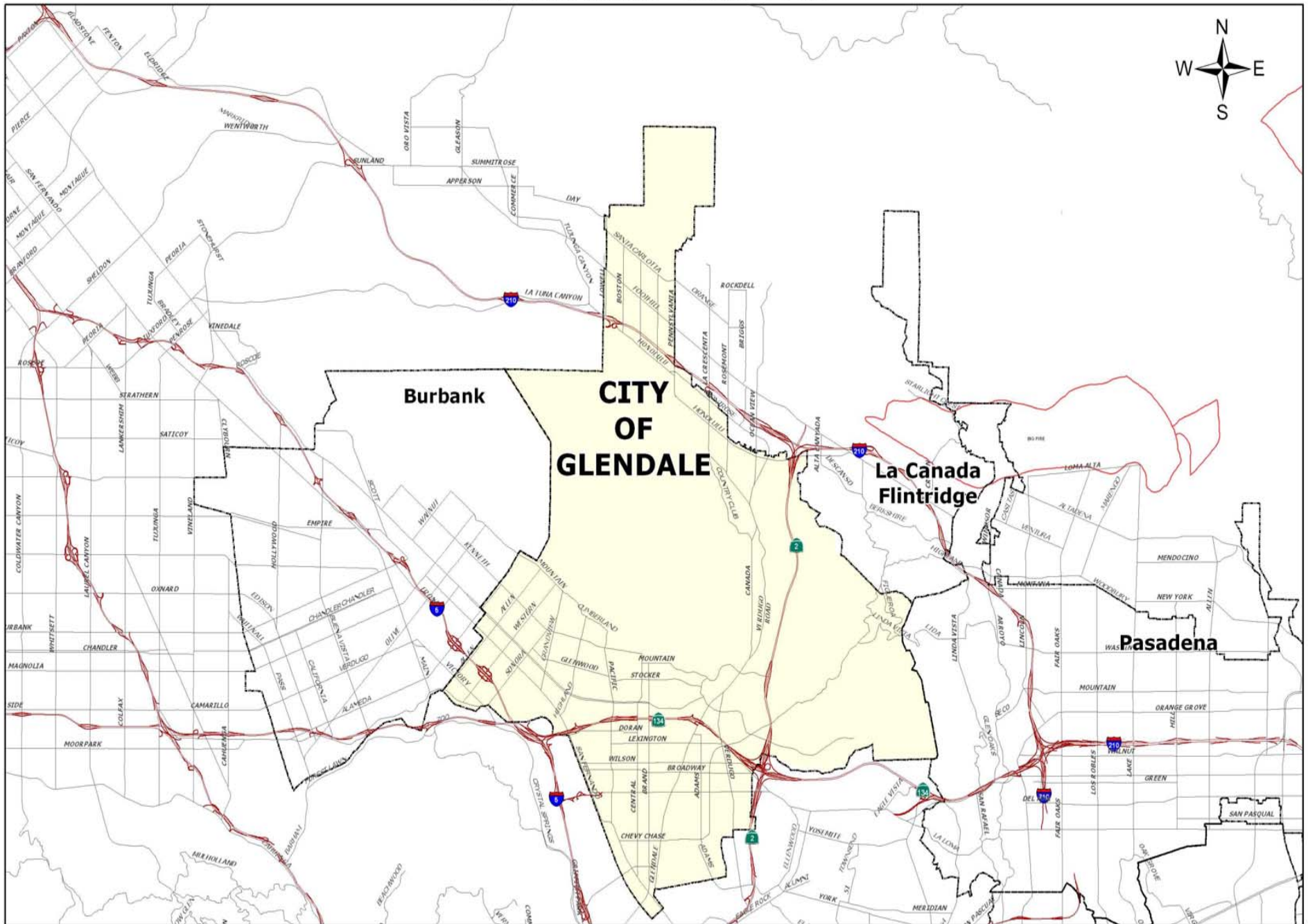

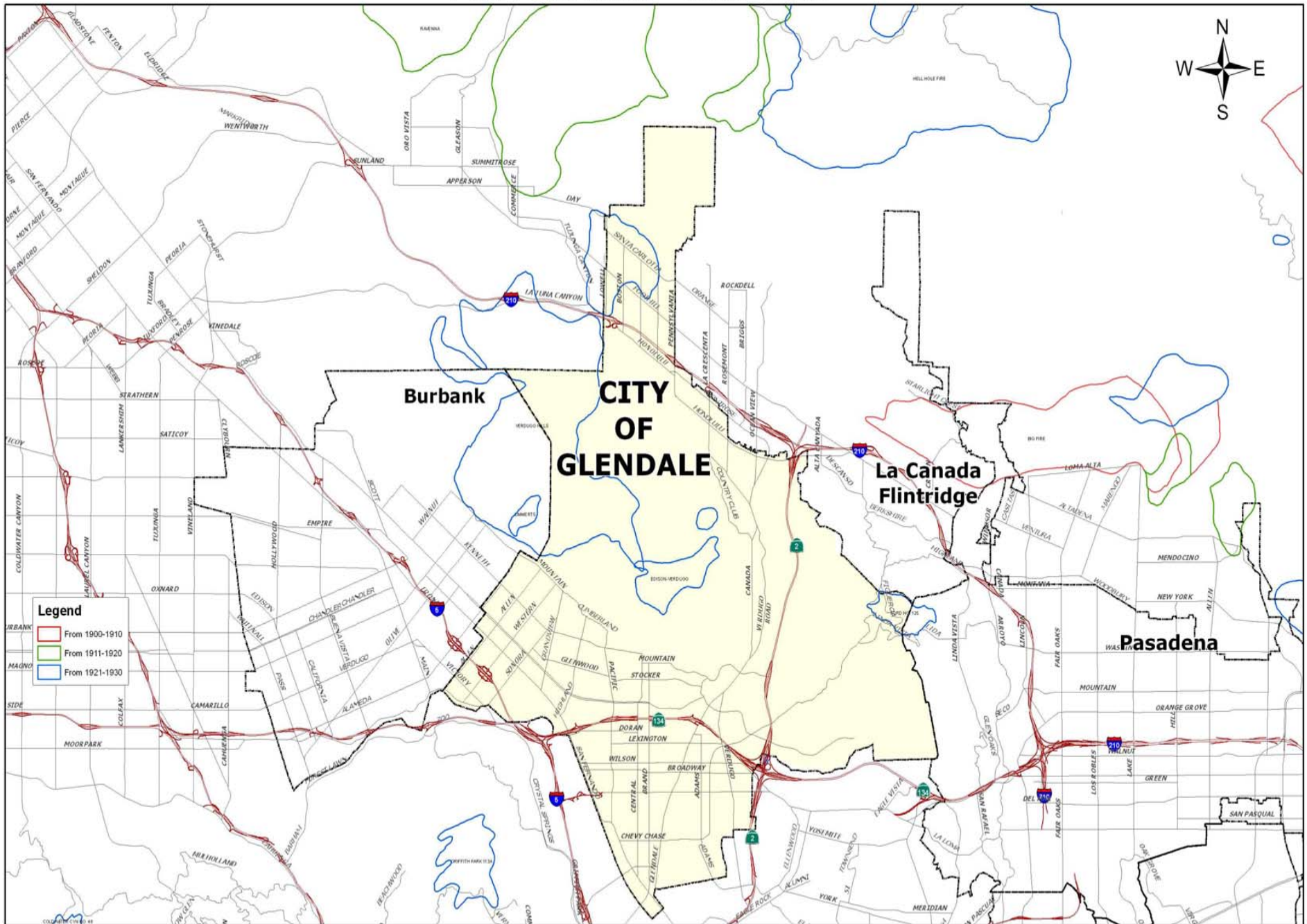
FIRE HISTORY 1900-1910



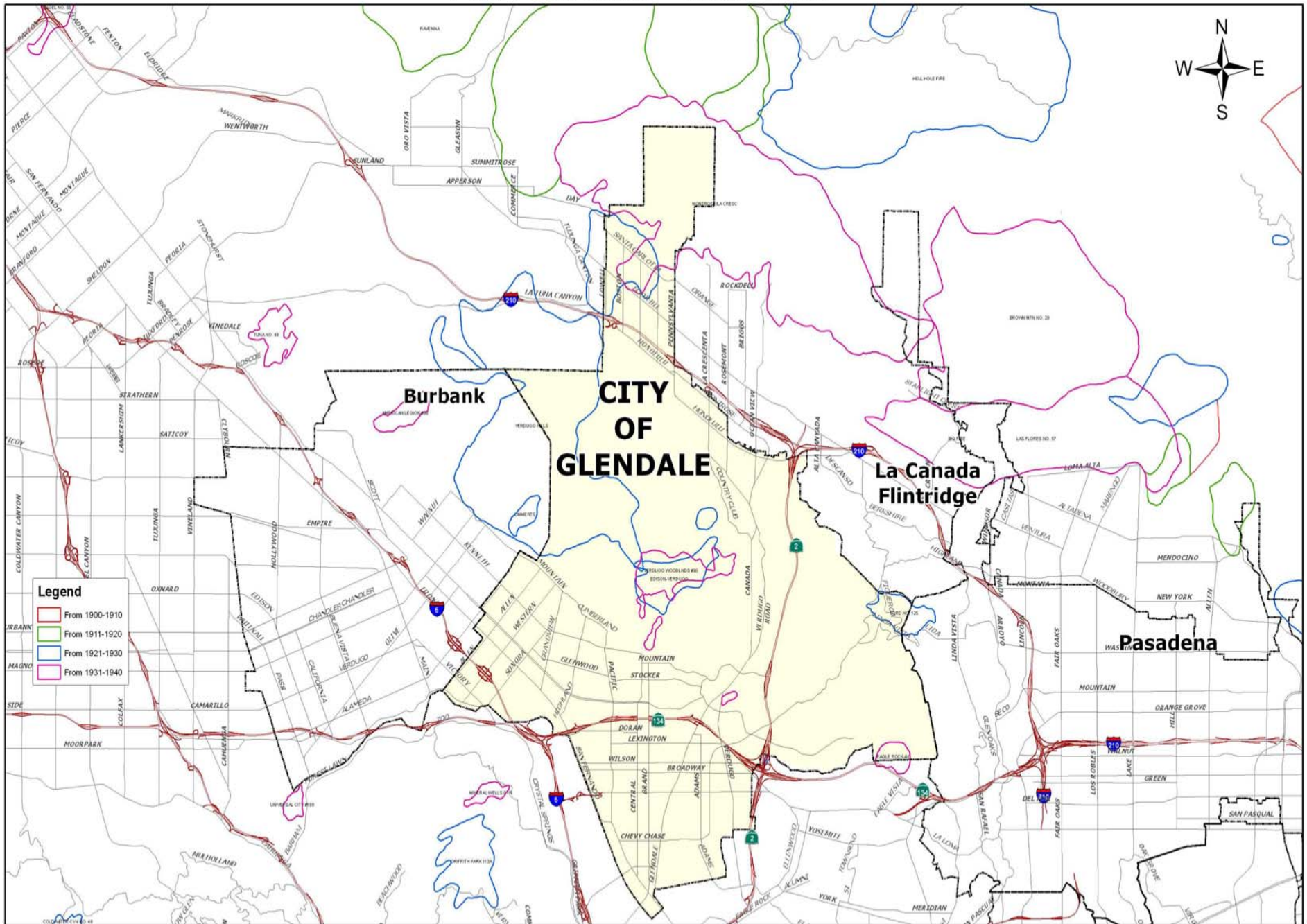

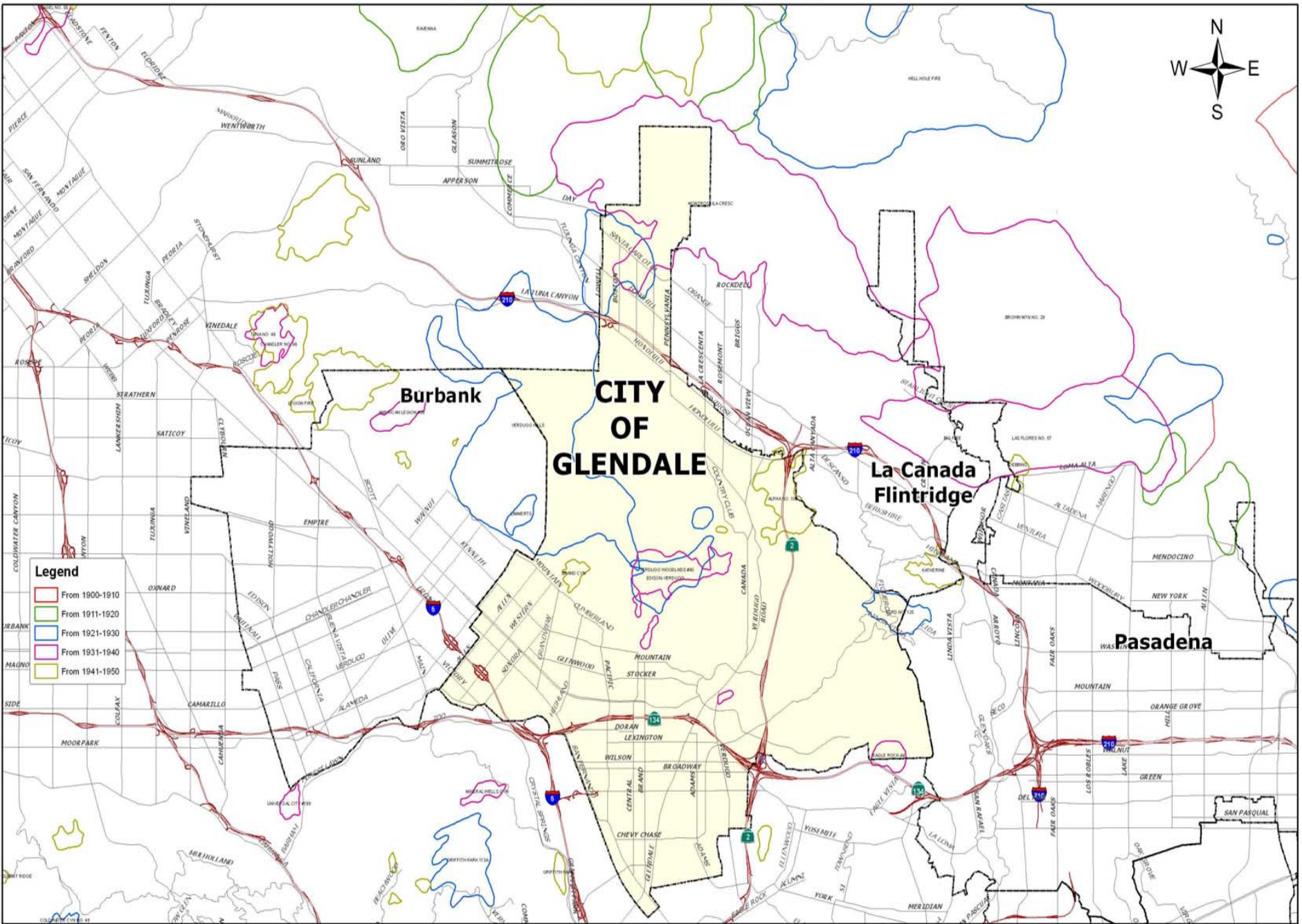

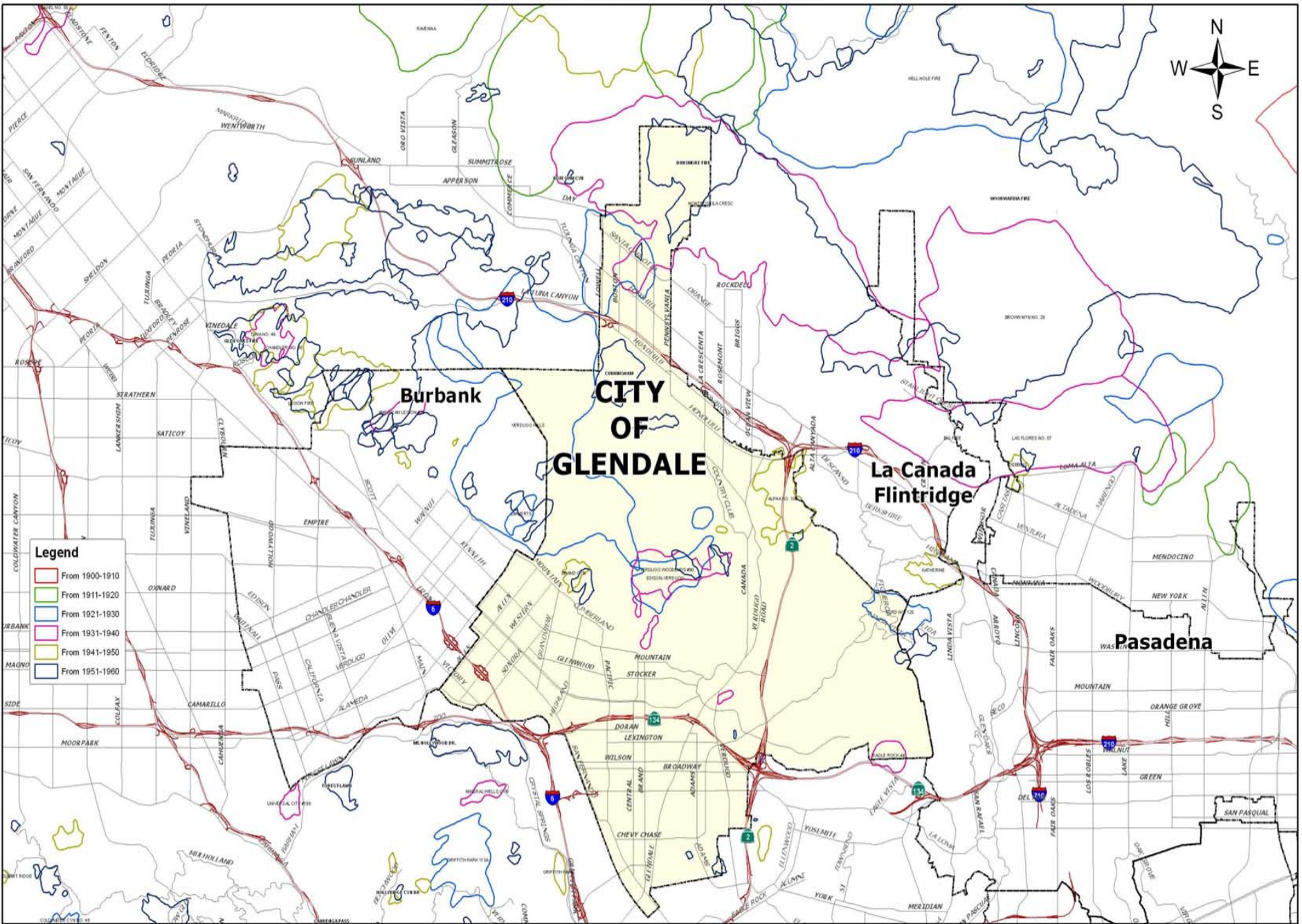

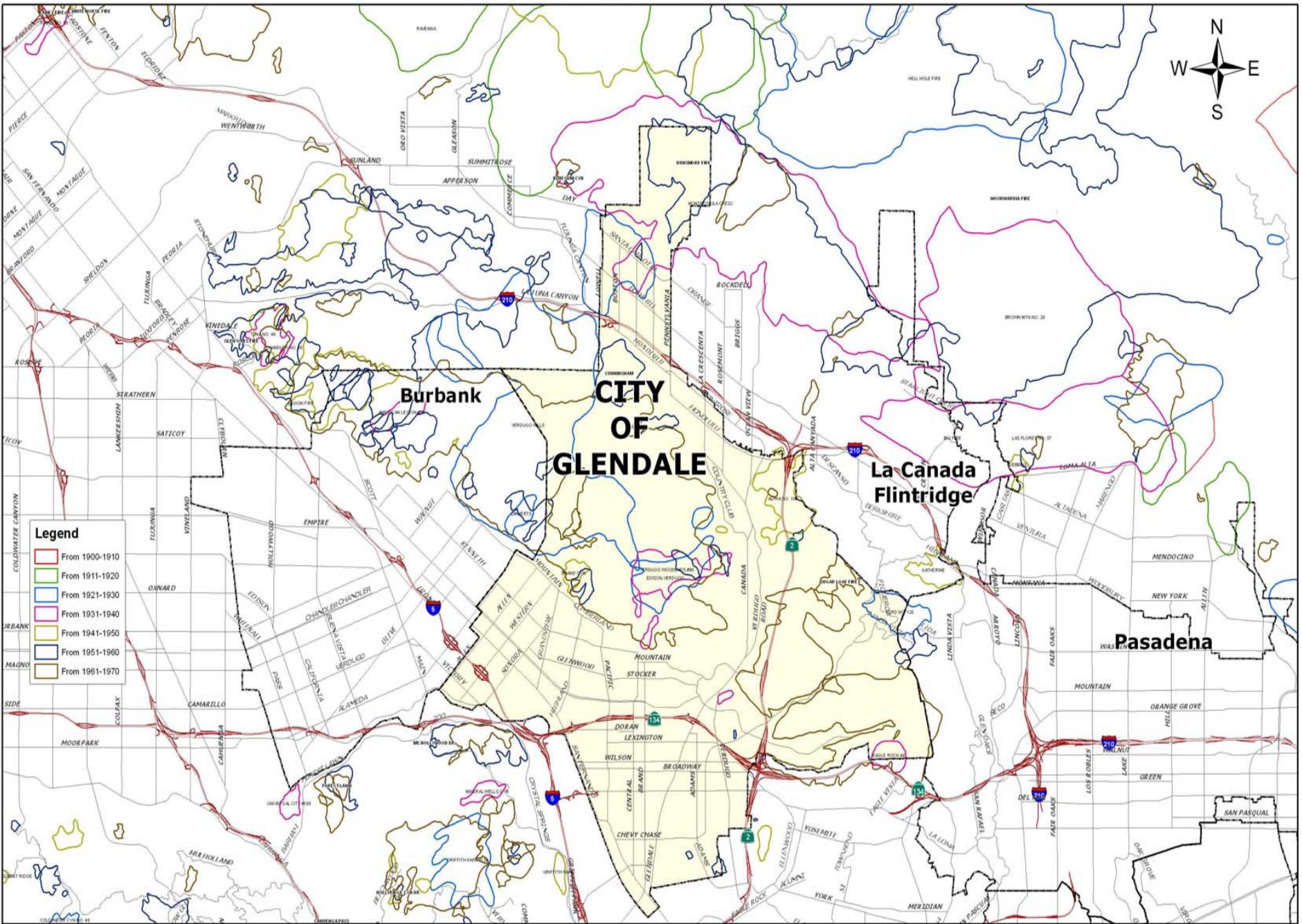
