

Glendale Fire Department Hosts NFIRS Training

Over a three-day period, the Glendale Fire Department hosted a rare training opportunity that provided an overview of the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS). Through collaboration between the City of Glendale and the Office of the State Fire Marshal, Chief Tonya Hoover arranged for a member of her staff to present the training sessions locally in Glendale, thereby facilitating participation by numerous Southern California fire agencies.

Kirsti Fong, who oversees the NFIRS program for California, repeated the 3-hour NFIRS training session between June 30, 2014 through July 2, 2014, which enabled participation by eighteen (18) separate fire agencies. A total of 76 individuals participated, encompassing 17 different personnel classifications:
