Project Background & Objectives

Project Background

Council approved DIF Strategic Plan on March 29, 2016 - \$16M – includes 2 multi-purpose fields in partnership with GUSD

Glendale has a high demand for multipurpose fields available for youth activities

Significant portion of City of Glendale youth activities occur on GUSD sites as only three City owned sites have lit multipurpose fields





Project Objectives

- 1. Provide a recreational multi-purpose athletic field for City of Glendale residents.
- 2. Due to limited public space, utilize existing space for joint use recreational activities.
- 3. Respond to City of Glendale residents' request for youth athletic playing fields.
- 4. Conserve water resources by replacing natural turf field with no water/non-living artificial turf field.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)


Purposes of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

- All projects within the State of California are required to undergo environmental review to determine the environmental impacts associated with implementation of the project
- Informs the public and decision makers about the project and about the potential environmental impacts
- Identifies feasible ways to avoid or reduce potential impacts
- Discloses any Significant and Unavoidable Impacts
- Provides an opportunity for the public and local/state agencies to comment on the environmental issues

Overview of CEQA Process

Publish Notice of Preparation/Initial Study

- 30-day public review period (08/01/2017 to 09/01/2017)
- Scoping Meeting 08/17/2017 (Public Input)

Prepare and Publish Draft EIR

- 45-day public review period
- Public Meeting (Public Input)

Prepare and Publish Response to Comments/Final EIR

- City Council adopts Findings
- City Council adopts a Mitigation Measures and Monitoring Program
- City Council adopts a Statement of Overriding Considerations, if necessary

Types of Impacts Identified in Initial Study

No Impact

A designation of No Impact is given when no adverse changes in the environment are expected; not to be studied further in the EIR

Less-than-Significant

A Less-than-Significant impact would cause no substantial adverse change in the environment; not to be studied further in the EIR

Potentially Significant

A Potentially Significant impact may cause significant adverse effects on the environment requiring mitigation, and will be studied in an environmental impact report





Initial Study Findings: No Impacts

The Project will have a "No Impact" on:

- Agricultural and Forestry Resources
- Biological Resources
- Land Use and Planning
- Mineral Resources
- Population and Housing
- Recreation

These issues will <u>not</u> be studied further in the EIR





Initial Study Findings: Less-than-Significant Impacts

The Project will have a "Less-than-Significant Impact" on:

- Cultural Resources
- Geology and Soils
- Hazards and HazardousMaterials
- Hydrology and Water Quality

- Public Services
 - •Fire and Police Services
- Tribal Cultural Resources
- Utilities and Service Systems

These issues will <u>not</u> be studied further in the EIR





Initial Study Findings:Potentially Significant Impacts

The Project will have a "Potentially Significant Impact" on:

- Aesthetics
- Air Quality
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions
- Noise
- Transportation and Traffic


Noise Study: Measurement Locations








Traffic: Study Intersections


