## NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** to all responsible agencies and interested parties that the City of Glendale, as Lead Agency, has prepared an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) that evaluates the potential environmental impacts of the proposed project identified below. The IS/MND indicates that the proposed project would not result in significant environmental impacts with incorporation of the prescribed mitigation measures.

**Project Title:** Glendale 2018 Wastewater Change Petition

**Project Applicant:** City of Glendale

**Project Location:** The proposed project site includes the Glendale Water & Power (GWP) and

Pasadena Water & Power (PWP) service areas within the Cities of Glendale and Pasadena, as well as adjacent portions of the City of San Marino, City of Los Angeles, City of La Canada-Flintridge, and unincorporated community of Altadena, and is generally bounded by the San Gabriel Mountains to the north; the City of Sierra Madre to the east; the State Route (SR) 134 (Ventura Freeway), SR-2 (Glendale Freeway), and the Los Angeles River to the south;

and the City of Burbank, Griffith Park, and Verdugo Hills to the west.

**Project Description:** The City of Glendale proposes to gradually decrease the volume of treated

wastewater discharged from the Los Angeles-Glendale Water Reclamation Plant (LAGWRP) to the Los Angeles River (River) in order to increase the delivery of recycled water to various users within the GWP and PWP service areas, as well construction and operation of new recycled water distribution facilities to serve

new customers within the GWP service area.
