Johanna Turner has been tracking mountain lions in the Verdugo, San Gabriel, and Santa Monica mountains for ten years, working with Arroyos and Foothills Conservancy, Mountain Lion Foundation and National Wildlife Federation, as well as cooperating with the National Park Service mountain lion study.

This lecture will feature beautiful wildlife photography of our local mountain lions. Get to know the secretive big cats who share your foothills (some are famous enough to have nicknames!) and find out how motion-sensing 'camera traps' work. Learn how to identify a mountain lion track and other signs you might see on your hikes. She looks forward to answering your questions about P41, Nikita, Adonis, and how the lions in the Woolsey Fire burn area are doing.
