Engaged at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art since 1981, with a two year hiatus as Research Fellow at the University of Kyoto in Japan between 1986-1988, Hollis Goodall is now Curator of Japanese Art. She oversees installations in the Pavilion for Japanese Art, planning of exhibitions for the Japanese department and, in cooperation with other museum departments, educational programs, web programming, as well as collection management, growth, and research. In her 38 years at LACMA, she has overseen more than 275 exhibitions and installations, and is presently researching the LACMA's collection of nearly 7000 Japanese objects.
