UNEMPLOYMENT RESOURCES

Many Californians are facing unemployment due to COVID-19.

- *Unemployment Insurance (UI):* If your employer reduces your hours or shuts down operations due to COVID-19, you are eligible to receive UI.
 - The fastest way to apply for UI is online.
- Federal Unemployment Benefits: Click here for information on the \$600 additional unemployment benefits funded by the federal government.
- Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA):
 Provides unemployment benefits to individuals who have become unemployed due to a Presidentially declared major disaster, and who do not qualify for regular state unemployment benefits.
 - Check <u>this link</u> regularly to verify if DUA becomes available.

HEALTH INSURANCE

If you lose your job, there are ways to stay covered.

- • COBRA Continuation Coverage: For workers and their families who have had a lapse of employment or lost their jobs due to the the outbreak, COBRA Continuation Coverage may be the right choice for you.
 - <u>Click here</u> to find out if you are eligible.
- Medicare/Medicaid:

Medicare typically provides health insurance for people aged 65 and older ,while Medicaid provides insurance to low-income individuals, families and children, pregnant women, the elderly, and people with disabilities.

 <u>Determine your eligibility for both</u> <u>programs.</u>

- Special enrollment: Due to COVID-19, you can apply for health coverage through Covered California if you are uninsured regardless of enrollment period.
 - See if you are eligible.

FAMILIES IN NEED

Assistance is available for families impacted by COVID-19.

- CalWORKs: If a family has little or no cash and needs housing, food, utilities, clothing or medical care, it may be eligible to receive immediate shortterm help.
 - <u>Learn more and see if you are</u>
 <u>eligible for CalWORKs assistance.</u>
- CalFRESH: CalFresh (formerly known as Food Stamps) provides monthly benefits to assist low-income households in purchasing food. <u>Apply</u> here.
 - Access an emergency application.

 Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP):

Through LIHEAP, eligible low-income families can receive financial assistance to offset the costs of heating and/or cooling dwellings, and/or have their dwellings weatherized to make them more energy efficient. Determine your eligibility.
