In Glendale, hazardous vegetation near homes is one of the major contributors to catastrophic wildland fires. Dry grass, weeds, shrubs, and flammable landscaping can bring the fire right to your home, whether you live on a hillside or not. Creating defensible space is essential to improving your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. It's the buffer you create between your house and the vegetation that surrounds it. As an owner of property within the High Fire Hazard Area (HFHA) you are required to maintain a defensible space around your property for your safety and the safety of the community. The Glendale Fire Department annually inspects properties in the High Fire Hazard Area to ensure that the defensible space standards are met. Inspections typically commence **May 1st**.

Please follow the hazardous vegetation abatement actions described in the Defensible Space Standards brochure. Your cooperation in completing the abatement work before the annual inspection will improve the overall effectiveness of this program. The Fire Department will notify you in writing if any additional vegetation management is required.

The Glendale Fire Department would like to thank you for your cooperation in this community wide fire prevention program. Included with this letter is the Defensible Space Standards brochure with guidelines for maintaining the vegetation around your home.
