Question/Comment No. 1 – (Victor Palas)

There is a speeding issue on Concord. Will the speed limit be adjusted and mitigated as a result of this Project?

Response to Question/Comment No. 1:

The most recent Engineering and Traffic Survey (E&TS) to confirm the speed limit was completed in 2021. The E&TS recommended maintaining the existing 30 MPH speed limit on Concord Street, from Doran Street to Glenoaks Boulevard. Based on the California Vehicle Code, the E&TS is valid for minimum of 7 years and up to 14 years.

Concord Street, north of Fairmont Avenue is a Community Collector street and can be evaluated for potential traffic calming, however, there are no current open traffic calming requests in the Public Works Traffic Engineering Customer Service database. Response to Question/Comment No. 3:

A minimum of one traffic lane at each direction of travel will be made available to vehicular traffic during construction on Concord Street and all streets scheduled for improvement. However, traffic may be interrupted intermittently during various
