## Barth Days

Earth Day is an annual celebration occurring every April 22, uniting people worldwide in a shared mission: to honor and protect our planet.

Since 1970, Earth Day has developed into a global movement that brings together individuals, communities, and governments to take action against issues such as climate change, pollution, and habitat destruction.

It's a day to celebrate nature's beauty and highlight our critical responsibility in protecting it for future generations.



## Barth Day

- After the devastating Santa Barbara oil spill, advocacy started for more regulatory policy.
- April 22, 1970: Senator Gaylord Nelson and Harvard student Denis Hayes organize the first Earth Day, drawing millions to advocate for a sustainable environment.








 The 1980 Earth Day event started the decade with critical legislature in place such as: Endangered Species Act, Marine Mammal Protection Act, Superfund, Toxics Substances Control Act, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, Clean Air Act and Clean Water Act as well the formation of the Environmental Protection Agency



### 1995-2009

- Earth Day embraces the internet, engaging people worldwide in environmental activism.
- Earth Day 2000 sees coordination among 5,000 environmental groups in 184 countries.
- The 40th anniversary highlights the urgency of climate action with global events.







- Earth Day Network launches the Billion Acts of Green campaign.
- The Paris Agreement is signed on Earth Day, a milestone in the fight against climate change.

### 2021-2022

- Earth Day 2021- emphasized global action on climate crisis and biodiversity loss.
- Earth Day 2022- "Invest in Our Planet" becomes the theme, engaging over one billion participants.







- Earth Day 2023 The theme of sustainability continues, accompanied by captivating images of Earth from deep space.
- Earth Day 2024- "Planet vs. Plastics" becomes the Global theme for the Earth Day, bringing everyone together to push for the end of plastics for the sake of human and planetary health.

In celebration of the theme Planet vs. Plastic, the City of Glendale's 2024 Earth Day is **zero waste**.

During the Fair, there will be easy sustainable actions you can spring into! We will have a clothing swap and a free-free market. 


