# City Manager's Report No. 166 June 21, 2024

### 1. Taxpayer Protection and Government Accountability Act Blocked

In a significant victory for California cities, the State Supreme Court unanimously ruled that the Taxpayer Protection and Government Accountability Act cannot appear on the November ballot. This anti-tax measure, which would have made it more difficult to raise taxes or fees, was deemed a constitutional revision requiring a more rigorous process. Spearheaded by the California Business Roundtable, the measure had garnered sufficient signatures but faced widespread opposition from cities. The court's decision allows local governments to continue focusing on essential services without the constraints the measure would have imposed.

At least 246 cities passed resolutions opposing the measure with opponents calling it "an existential threat" to government operations. In <u>a statement</u>, Cal Cities CEO Carolyn Coleman said the following: "No amount of funding from wealthy corporations will change the fact that the California Supreme Court decided the Taxpayer Deception Act is unconstitutional. It's great news for cities and their residents that this dangerous initiative will not move forward this year, and local officials can now keep their focus on delivering vital local services." ### 4. Cooling Centers to Open on Saturday

In anticipation of the upcoming heat wave, the Community Services & Parks Department is activating four community centers as cooling centers starting Saturday, June 22, 2024, through Sunday, June 23, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The City is highly encouraging those who do not have a cool place to be during the hottest time of the day to come to one of four community centers to beat the heat and cool off. Pets are allowed but must be always kept on a leash. The cooling centers will be at the Adult Recreation Center, Sparr Heights Community Center, Maple Park Community Center, and Pacific Community Center.

We also have various options to keep cool through water play. Our splash pad at Cerritos Park is open 11:00 am to 6:00 pm daily, our wading pools are open to the public on alternating days at Dunsmore Park, Brand Park, Fremont Park, Glenoaks Park and Palmer Park, and our Pacific Community Pool is open daily for recreation swim.

As a reminder, if you plan to be outdoors, please take the following precautions to protect yourself from the sun and heat:

- Avoid the sun from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. when the burning rays are strongest.
- Reduce physical activity.
- Wear wide-brimmed hat and light-colored, lightweight, loose-fitting clothes when you are outdoors.
- Avoid hot, heavy meals that include proteins.
- Set your air conditioner between 75° to 80°. If you don't have air-conditioning, take a cool shower twice a day.
- Drink plenty of fluids, even if you are not thirsty. Avoid alcohol and caffeine.
- Use sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15 if you need to be in the sun.
- Stay in shade whenever working outdoors.
- Don't forget about your pets; they need plenty of water and shade.

Symptoms of dehydration and heat cramps include dizziness, fatigue, faintness, headaches, rapid heartbeat, muscle cramps and increased thirst. Anyone experiencing these symptoms should seek immediate medical attention or call 911.
